

During the last batch of storms that blew into Le Roy a week ago, our fence sustained some damage. A chunk of our neighbor's tree broke off and fell on one of the fence panels, completely collapsing it. Until we can get the panel replaced in a couple weeks, there's a big hole in our back yard fence. This is great news to our dog, Fenny, who is eager to test his freedom boundaries by exiting that hole and exploring the neighborhood unfettered by responsibility. Vonette and I agree that this is a terrible idea, as our dog has no sense of responsibility, so until the hole in the fence is patched and the fencing replaced, he is only allowed in the back yard leashed and escorted. Fenny is unhappy with the arrangement, as he'd like to go exploring. There's only one problem—he's terrified by most of the outside world! He loves going on walks with us in the neighborhood, but alone? Not so much... Left to his own devices, he'd stay in the yard, until he was distracted by chasing a squirrel or rabbit, critters we have in abundance in town. He'd likely get lost, or worse, get hit by a car while blindly chasing woodland creatures, or wreck up someone's yard searching for food (he's ruled by his stomach, not his brain) So, for his own good, we set boundaries for him to protect him from himself.

It occurs to me that we're very much like Fenny, myself included. We long for the freedom to do whatever we want, but too often, when we exercise it, we sin and get ourselves into trouble, much like Fenny would get into trouble if we let him loose in the neighborhood. Paul reminds us in Galatians 5:13, "You, my brothers and sisters, were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the flesh; rather, serve one another humbly in love." This verse is a precursor to the Fruits of the Spirit we all know in Galatians 5:22-23. But it's more than just a laundry list of things we should be doing with our lives—it's the exclamation point on what Jesus has done for us. Jesus told the Jews following Him around in John 8:36, "If the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed." And that is why Paul can proclaim in Romans 8:1, 'Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus." Just like Fenny is safest and happiest when he can roam the back

yard, but with the boundaries of the fence, we have freedom in Jesus, but still need the law to point out areas of sin in our lives so that we can reject sin and strive to be more Christ-like in our behavior. And just like Fenny gets into trouble by getting distracted outside the fence, we too get distracted by sinful impulses outside the guidance of Jesus and the Holy Spirit. That is why we are best when we are willingly led by the Holy Spirit living inside us, not running amok like Fenny off leash.

I encourage you to continue to abide with the Holy Spirit remembering that the freedom you have in Jesus is greater than the freedom you'd have on your own.

It's been hard to be patient through this process, but believe it or not, the gas meter has <u>finally</u> been moved and within the next week or so the excavator will arrive to start work readying the area for construction of the new east entrance. The goal, of course, is to get the outside work mostly complete before bad weather arrives.

The next step inside is getting the walls framed for the new upstairs bathrooms, nursery and offices. When the new plumbing is installed for the bathrooms, part of the basement fellowship hall ceiling has to come down. (Not pretty, but necessary).

This "thermometer" graph is a visual aide to watch our contributions grow to pay towards the \$300,000 that we intend to borrow towards the project. We have received \$29,243 since the project was approved at the end of February. Our thanks to all who are helping to achieve our goal!
