


This is a story about the world's most glorious, impenetrable snow fort.

Growing up in rural Nebraska, we had our share of big snows, affording us the opportunity to build snow forts and have epic snowball fights. But one glorious year, conditions were perfect for a colossus of a snow fort on the school grounds. First, a rare northern wind placed 4 foot tall snow drifts in front of the school, instead of across the street in the corn field where we couldn't go during recess. Next, perfect weather conditions (below freezing, but sunny and warm enough to turn the snow perfectly mushy, not powdery) allowed us to scoop out those giant drifts during recess. It started out as a cave during the first recess, but by lunchtime recess, it had become an impenetrable fort, with walls of snow and ice. And by the time the third and final recess rolled around in the afternoon, war was inevitable. We had our fort, we had a huge supply of snowballs, and all our competition had was a measly dozen or snow large snowballs hiding behind a propane tank near our fort. And when that final recess bell rang, we were ready for battle! But we couldn't find our foes. Had they given up in the face of overwhelming tactical winter superiority? Not quite. Their plan (actually, quite brilliant) was to enlist the aid of a couple larger "neutral" students to stand on top of our fort, collapsing it under their weight. While we were digging ourselves out, they casually strolled over with their dozen giant snowballs and cheerfully dropped them on our heads. It was a humiliating winter defeat, and it demonstrated the folly of putting your trust in something that was never meant to last.

There are a lot of people in the world making that same mistake. They put their trust in their own works and their own lives. No one is immortal, and no one can earn their way to eternal life, because we all sin and we all fall short of God's glory (Romans 3:23). But on a starry night in Bethlehem over 2,000 years ago, God lifted us out of the collapsed ruins of our dead end lives with a simple gift—a baby named Jesus, wrapped in strips of cloth, lying in a manger. His wisdom would show us how to live abundantly, and his sacrifice on the cross would allow us to live abundantly eternally, free of sin

(Romans 6:23). And unlike any earthly thing we could put our trust in that won't last, Jesus is God, so His love and His sacrifice is forever!

I hope your Christmas this year is safe, joyful, and blessed. During your celebrations, take a moment to reflect on God's gift to us as you open your gifts. May we remember the greatest gift we could ever receive was given to us in Bethlehem that evening, and may we acknowledge the giver and the gift by giving up the life we can't keep, exchanging it for the life we can't lose. We do that by putting our trust in Jesus as our Savior. Merry Christmas!

Check out the old nursery area next time you're at the church building as the walls have been framed in for the new upstairs bathrooms, nursery and offices. The HVAC duct work is now in place as well. It's starting to get easier to visualize what it will look like when complete. Plumbing and wiring will be next while the walls and ceiling are still "open". When the south 1/2 of the downstairs ceiling comes down, the plan is to continue to make the area usable (for Sunday breakfasts etc.) but it may not look pretty for awhile.

Outside demolition is waiting for the ground to firm up a bit now, but should still happen in December even though winter is approaching.

This "thermometer" graph is a visual aide to watch our contributions grow to pay towards the \$300,000 that we intend to borrow towards the project. We have received \$32,233 since the project was approved at the end of February. Our thanks to all who are helping to achieve our goal!
