

# Meet Our Pastor

Rev. William "Bill" S. McLean, II

The Reverend Bill McLean was ordained as a Minister of the Word and Sacrament by the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) in 2007. Bill grew up in a small town in rural northeast Georgia. His parents and sister still live in that community and his brother lives on the Georgia coast.

Before becoming a transitional pastor, Bill served as the Presbyter for Congregational Care of the Presbytery of Southeastern Illinois for six years and prior to that as a solo pastor in rural Indiana for over 7 ½ years. Within the larger church, Bill has served on a presbytery's COM (Commission on Ministry) for five years including two years as the moderator. Additionally, Bill has served on a presbytery's council, as a synod commissioner, and twice as a commissioner to the General Assembly.

Ministry is Bill's second career after serving for almost six years with the federal government working on public health policy, management, and budget issues at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in Atlanta. Bill graduated from Princeton Theological Seminary with a Master of Divinity after receiving an MBA from Georgia Southern University and his undergraduate degree from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (UNC).

Bill lives in Urbana, Illinois with his wife, Kate, who is a librarian in the Urbana school district. Bill and Kate met while they were both attending UNC and continue to enjoy cheering for the Tar Heels. They have two teenage daughters, a high school senior and a seventh grader.

Bill will officially become part of our church family on May 1st as an Interim Pastor and will giving the message that morning.

We hope you will join us to welcome him into our congregation in the coming weeks as he brings us God's Word and provides pastoral support and encouragement when needed. A "Meet & Greet Luncheon will be held after worship on May 15th.

#### **Chicken Noodle Casserole Recipe**

2 12.5 ounce cans chicken, include broth 2 cans cream of mushroom soup

7.5 ounce Kluski noodles, uncooked 2 cups milk

2 cans cream of mushroom soup 2 cups milk 1/2 lb. Velveeta cheese (Can use shredded Velveeta in 8 oz. package)

Onion salt will be added at the church as the casseroles are served.

The day before, mix all the ingredients together in a bowl, cover and put in the refrigerator. Remove from refrigerator and put in a greased foil 9x13 baking dish. Bake 1 hour and 15 minutes at 350 degrees

Please deliver the warm casserole(s) to the church between 9 and 10 am on May 30th.



# reflections Dana Miller, Director of Student Ministries

May has always been one of my favorite months of the year. The weather is usually warm (but not TOO warm), making it easy to go outside and do fun things, or even just relax outside to get some needed fresh air and sunshine after being cooped up inside all winter. It's also a great time to start restoring the "man shed" in the back of the yard for use over the next six months. And, of course, the youth and kids I interact with all know that soon, school will be out, and summer will be here for even more fun. So I want to encourage all Christ followers to stand strong in their faith and love for Jesus Christ, walking in humility and obedience to the one who gave us eternal life by sacrificing Himself on the cross for our sins. May we never forget what He has done for us, and may we respond accordingly to what He has done for us!
