

Adapting Traditions

The tradition began on a bright sunny afternoon thirteen years ago. When our kids get home from school on the last day of school, Mom and I ambush them for a water battle. Kindergarten was a complete surprise for our oldest, but by first grade the bus was exited at a running start and the battle was on.

Then we were hit with the reality of a pandemic and AP exams. We no longer had a traditional last day of school or early dismissal for seniors. Yet, instead of giving up beloved traditions we adapted them to our new reality.

So last year when waiting on the bus to arrive was no longer an option, we ambushed the oldest after textbooks were returned to the high school. And this year, our youngest orchestrated ambushing Kate (who is a school librarian) this past Friday when she came home from her year-end checkout on the last day of school.

And something amazing happened. The world did not come to an end. Sure, things are different, but the laughter and soaking clothes were just as authentic as all the years before.

Since March 2020, we have all adapted and adjusted in ways we would never have imagined in February 2020. And much like our family water battle . . . the world did not come to an end. Traditions and customs were adapted (and sometimes even dropped entirely) so that we could care for each other.

It has been a joy to see all the ways that congregations and individuals have adapted to our rapidly changing environment. The resiliency and creativity of ministries is awe inspiring.

As we have transitioned back to more familiar formats for gathering and interacting, it is important that we do not forget the adaptability and skills we have developed during the pandemic. We are called to continue exploring and experimenting with how to include everyone in our worship and fellowship.

While things might be different, the joy, love, and grace we experience as we come together as the body of Christ in the world is just as authentic.

As part of the Mission Study Task Force's gathering of information, we invite everyone to enter into a discussion of "Norms" in our church.

"Norms" are the social standards that have become ingrained into our congregation's culture as to how we relate with each other in our various interactions.

They can be looked at as both positive and negative. An easy example would be how many have a pew they sit in on Sundays and

everyone knows where they will be and to not sit there. Regulars may be off put if a visitor sits in their usual spot. Another discussion point might be how we handle conflict. Do we address it head on in a meeting or do we wait until after and stand in the parking lot debating it?

Other examples may be harder to think of and this illustrates why this meeting is so important. The "norms" of our congregation (and any social group) get so deep-rooted that they have become automatic, and we don't even think about questioning what kind of impact they are having. It is important to bring them to light so we can consider what are the "norms" that are having a positive impact, to highlight and reinforce them, and which are having a negative impact, to address and potentially modify them to the betterment of our congregation and interaction with each other.

These devotional booklets aim to offer deeper edification in applying scripture to everyday life. Titles include: "Humble Hearts - Open Hands", "Gospel Conversations", "What is Worship?" and more.

Also of inspiration, another gem from the devotional section of our library--Sow the Word... Harvest Character: A Year of Devotions for the Growing Christian by Kenton K. Smith. Presented as an almanac, the spiritual advice format involves: plow - prepare your heart for the Word; sow - identify/focus on a character trait; cultivate - identify distractors/weeds; water - nourish with easy-tomemorize nuggets from scripture. I have fond memories of my eighth grade graduation—sort of. You may recall I've told the story about how I graduated from Brugh School in rural Fremont, Nebraska. Brugh was a two room country schoolhouse, with K-4th grade in one room, and 5th-8th grade in the other room. When I graduated from Brugh in May 1981, my graduating class was only two people—myself, and a girl named Suzie Steinbach. I remember at the time thinking it was so weird to make a big deal about 8th grade graduation—particularly since I had four more years of school to go, not counting college. To be honest, I really didn't place a whole lot of value on this experience. Had it not been for the great cloud of witnesses who came up to me and told me to treasure and remember this day, I probably wouldn't have. It would have been just another day growing up, one in a seemingly never ending litany of days to have to slug through until I could graduate from high school (now, THAT would be something, I thought....) But I'm glad I heeded the advice of those around me and not my younger self, and remembered the special nature of that day. Now knowing what a unique experience I went through as a child, that 8th grade graduation means far more to me now than it did when I was younger and less mature.

Those of us who have been Christ followers for a long time, if we don't guard our hearts, can be guilty of the same thing in our faith walk. I know I have. When we've been believers for a long time, it can be easy to take for granted the immense privilege we have. We are children of God! We are indwelled with the Holy Spirit! We can come to him with our praises, problems, and anything in between! What an incredible privilege this is! I don't know about you, but I have gone through seasons where I have had to fight the sense that all this is, well, not special. Sure, someday we'll be with Jesus in heaven, and THAT will be something, but today? Today is just another day in a long litany of days to slug through, waiting for that special day to meet my Savior.

I want to encourage you to not take these days, and the gifts we have been given now, for granted. Each day is special! We graduate from the previous day, hopefully a little wiser, a little closer to imitating Jesus than the day before, and we STILL have those treasures and privileges I mentioned earlier. When life seems like a giant slog of one day after

another, God reminds us that our time, and what we do with it, matters. Speaking about his chosen people in Isaiah 33:6, "He will be the sure foundation for your times, a rich store of salvation and wisdom and knowledge; the fear of the Lord is the key to this treasure." Acknowledging what an awesome God we have, and how special and lavish the gifts He has given us are, we can be alert for opportunities to draw others closer to Christ by showing what He has done for our lives. The extraordinary gift of Jesus can transform our days from ordinary to extraordinary, too!
