




Dear Church Family~


July Library Corner


BUILDING FUND

We have received \$ 91,408 since our renovation project was approved. Our thanks to all who are helping to achieve our goal!


Several things have been accomplished recently to set the stage for more obvious progress.


The first year Robert went, we stopped for lunch in a town outside Seattle. I gave him \$10 with instructions to use the money for lunch at that stop and lunch on the way back two days later. Instead, Robert went to a taco place and spent all \$10 on the largest burrito I have ever seen in my life (seriously, it was the size of a small pillow). He couldn't even eat all of it and took half of it with him for "second dinner" that night. And, of course, when we stopped for lunch on the way back, he had no money to spend on lunch. But even then, Robert was solving problems. He went to his teacher with sad puppy dog eyes, remarking that he had no money for lunch. His teacher, Mrs. Clearman, replied, "Good thing you have your dad with you to get you lunch..." Tempted as I was to let my son starve (a little), I had to be responsible and make sure he was able to get lunch. To this day, Robert still won't tell me if he planned this to get extra food, but I have my suspicions....

We are fortunate to serve a God that is far more generous and gracious to us! James 1:17 reminds us, "Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows." We don't have to hope that our Savior is in a good mood when we come to Him with our prayers and petitions, because we matter to Him. The next verse, 18, says "He chose to give us birth through the word of truth, that we might be a kind of first fruits of all he created." Even though I was a bit annoyed at Robert for spending all of his money on one meal, I

was still proud of him for qualifying for this prestigious scholastic tournament.

That God gave us life as a way to display us as a living example of the best of His creation shows how much He loves and values us. So how should we respond? 
