And you thought last year's Easter was a bit unsettling....

Last year, we were just worried about COVID. This year, we're watching a war unfolding due to a country simply looking to take something they wanted that they couldn't otherwise have. The rest of the world is lining up to take sides to help the bullied country as much as possible, without getting drawn into a global war. And here in our country? Rising gas prices, rising food prices, rising taxes, interrupted supply chains on anything and everything—kind of makes you long for the "peaceful" days of 2021, doesn't it? It's crazy, but true! We remember the uncertainty that COVID brought last year, and we all took solace in the hope that things simply had to get better next year. Well, it's next year, and while COVID appears to finally be winding down, other problems are just ramping up. Once again, we face an Easter season filled with fear, doubt, and uncertainty as to what could possibly happen next. Many folks I've talked to are concerned about the future, both here and beyond, and it's hard to blame them.

That's why I think it's actually kind of appropriate that Easter is just around the corner, just when we need it most. In a world filled with darkness, discouragement, and hopelessness, Easter is the encouragement we need most right now. In Jesus' time, the disciples faced a dark world that day after Jesus was crucified. They had just seen the Lord die on the cross, they were reeling from a betraval from among their own ranks, a denial of Jesus in a self-serving attempt to save their own skin, and the fear of knowing that Jewish religious leaders were on the hunt for them next. I can't imagine being in a situation where you quite literally feel like the world is against you, but that's where the disciples found themselves in the days immediately following Jesus' death. Even so, as dark as the situation seemed, God was still in control. Jesus wasn't joking when He said on the cross in John 19:30, "It is finished." It's more than just our Savior taking the sins of the world, then, now, and forever, onto his outstretched arms. It extends to the truth that the power of sin, fear, and doubt over our lives has ended. Jesus conquered sin. He conquered death. And the resurrection was the final stamp by God that demonstrated Christ's victory. For the disciples, Jesus' appearance after His resurrection demonstrated His victory, and proved that no power on earth could defeat God's plans, For us today, it means that even though we live in an uncertain world, we have a certain, glorious future thanks to Jesus and His sacrifice for us.

I'd like to invite you to hear this good news on Easter Sunday. I'll be preaching a sermon titled, "Why the Resurrection Matters." Jesus' death and resurrection is more than just a nice story—it's the reason we as Christ followers can have hope in a hopeless world, and it's the proof that our faith is more than an empty wish for a better life down the road. I hope you'll join us Easter Sunday, and invite a friend or neighbor that could also use a little hope in their lives, too.






